REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVEL

ANCIENT EGYPT LIGHT OF THE WORLD

June 25: THE BEGINNING OF OUR EXPLORING TOUR

Leave Washington, Dulles via EgyptAir jet service to Cairo. Meals will be served on board.

June 26: INTO THE LAND OF THE PHARAOHS / THE EGYPTIAN MUSEUM

Arrival in Cairo. You will be met and transferred to your bus. Take a morning visit to the Egyptian Museum with its renowned collection of well-preserved pharaonic antiquities. The Museum contains the world's most important collection of Egyptian antiquities, dating from the earliest times to the 6th century AD. The collection includes some of the artistic masterpieces of the world, including the treasures of Tut-Ankh-Amun. Return to hotel for check-in. *Harambee Gathering.*

June 27: MEMPHIS/SAKKARA/GIZA

Morning tour to Memphis and Sakkara. Located 20 miles southwest of Cairo, Memphis was one of the most important cities throughout the history of ancient Egypt and was once the capital of Egypt. Sakkara's Step Pyramid is the oldest in existence and is the world's first stone building. Proceed to Giza. Visit one of the Seven Wonders of the World, the pyramids of Khufu, Khafra and Menkara and Heremakhet (the Sphinx). Dinner and overnight.

June 28: NATIONAL MUSEUM OF EGYPTIAN CIVILIZATION / OLD CAIRO / LUXOR

The museum will display a collection of 50,000 artifacts. Tour of Old Cairo and the Khan el Khalili Bazaar where time will be allowed to browse and shop. Dinner and then transfer to the airport for your flight to Luxor.

June 29: WASET (LUXOR OR THEBES)/IPET ISUT (KARNAK) & SOUTHERN IPET (LUXOR) TEMPLES

Visit the Avenue of the Sphinxes at Ipet Isut (Karnak). View the gorgeous Hypostyle Hall, the Tekhenu (obelisks) of Queen Hatshepsut, and the Sacred Lake. Continue to the Southern Ipet (Temple of Luxor). Visit the White Chapel, Temple of Khonsu and Mout and the Temple of Amon. Return to your hotel for lunch/dinner. *Evening Lecture.*

June 30: TANTERA (DENDERA) (THE TEMPLE OF HTHR)/ABDU (ABYDOS)

Leave Waset early in the morning by bus to visit Tantera (the Temple of Ht Hr [Hathor]), drive to the ancient city of Abdu, and visit the Temple of Seti, the site of the grave of the head of Asar (Osiris). Return to your hotel in Waset in the late afternoon for dinner and overnight stay.

July 01: WASET (THEBES)/VALLEY OF THE KINGS, QUEENS AND NOBLES/ MEDINET HABU/ COLOSSI OF MEMNON

Morning visit to the Necropolis of Thebes on the West Bank. Drive to visit the Valley of the Kings, visit three tombs of your choice in the Valley of the Kings, such as Seti I or Ramses VI. Continue to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut and continue to Medinet Habu before you return to your hotel for dinner and overnight stay. *Evening Lecture.*

July 02: ASA RESTORATION / TOMB OF KARAKHAMUN

Visit the ASA RESTORATION PROJECT, the excavation of the tombs of Karakhamun and Karabasken. Return to your hotel in Luxor for lunch. Dinner and overnight. *Evening Lecture.*

July 03: WASET Full day of leisure. Dinner and overnight stay.

July 04: WASET (LUXOR)/ EDFU (THE TEMPLE OF HERU

[HORUS]/ KOMOMBO (THE TEMPLE OF SOBEK)/

ASWAN Leave Waset by bus and drive towards Edfu on the Left Bank. Visit the Temple of Heru (Horus) which was excavated by Auguste Mariette and is one of the best preserved in KMT. Continue to Komombo. On the hill, which you see long before you arrive in Komombo, is the Temple, with a double dedication to the Crocodile-head Sobek and the Sparrow-headed Haroeris (Heru). In the middle of the temple area, a sanctuary was built for each of these divinities. Double entrances lead through the pylons to the court, vestibule, pillared hall and the three antechambers to the Sanctuaries of the Gods. Resume your journey to Aswan to your hotel. Arrive in the afternoon for lunch/dinner.

July 05: ASWAN/ THE HIGH DAM/PILAK (PHILAE) TEMPLE & UNFINISHED TEKENU (OBELISK) OF HATSHEPSUT/ROCK TOMBS OF THE NOBLES

Morning visit to Pilak (Philae). After the completion of the lower Aswan Dam, the Temple of Aset on the Island of Philae was covered by the waters of the Nile for most of the year. When the flood gates of the dam were opened from July to November, the resulting drop in water level was such that the temple rose up out of the waters. In the recent past, all monuments on the Island of Philae were transferred to the small island of Agilkia nearby and rebuilt there. Visit the Temple, the oldest parts of which date from the 4th century BC. Ptolemies and Romans added to the Temple over the years until the 2nd century AD. Other buildings are Het Heru (Hathor Temple), Hadrian's Pylon, Horendotes Temple, the remains of the Temple of Augustus, and the lovely and famous Kiosk of Trajan. Continue to the High Dam which rises up on a colossal scale. The Pyramid of Khufu could be lost 17 times over in this modern marvel. Visit the Red Granite Quarries where the ancients obtained their fine reddish granite. See the unfinished tekhen (obelisk) of Queen Hatshepsut, had it been completed, it would have been the largest ever hewn. Return to your hotel in Aswan for dinner and overnight stay. *Evening Lecture.*

July 06: ASWAN/ABU SIMBEL (THE TEMPLE OF RAMSES II) ASWAN

Morning flight from Aswan to Abu Simbel which is situated on the West Bank of the Hapi (Nile River), 180 miles south of Aswan and some 27 miles north of Wadi Haifa. There lies the Great Temple, hewn in the rock, with the four colossal seated statues of the King in front of the entrance. It was dedicated to Amun-Ra, Ra-Herakhti, and Ramses II. The figures are 65 ½ feet high and wear the double crown. Nearby, to the north, is a second temple, also built by Ramses II, and dedicated to Nefertari, the King's wife. The temples, which were threatened by the waters on the completion of the Aswan High Dam have been preserved by international action organized by UNESCO. The most important parts of the temples (statues, inscribed slabs, etc.) have been rebuilt on a plateau above the former site. Return to Aswan. Transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight stay.

July 07: ASWAN Day at leisure. Dinner and overnight.

July 08: ASWAN / CAIRO Transfer to the airport in time for your return flight home via Cairo.

July 09: WASHINGTON, DULLES Arrive at Washington, Dulles Airport at 5:10 AM EST the next day.

TOUR CONDITIONS

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Economy class jet connecting IATA and ATC carriers. Airfare is based on SUPER APEX 6-21 days plus domestic add-on fares where applicable. Airfares are based on September 2021 rates and are subject to change without prior notice.

BAGGAGE: Limited to one normal size suitcase, the weight of which should not exceed 50 pounds. Flight bags, cosmetic bags, briefcases, and camera cases remain in the personal care of tour members and are not included in the 50 pounds.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Superior First Class Hotels, two persons sharing a twin bedroom with private bath. A limited number of single rooms are available at \$875.00 supplemental cost. Confirmation required before departure.

MEALS: TWO MEALS PER DAY: Full breakfast and dinner daily. Lunches is included on the excursion to Dandera.

SIGHTSEEING: As detailed in the itinerary, using comfortable and convenient transportation. English speaking government licensed guide. All entrance fees are included when applicable to specified sites.

TIPS: Tips associated with portering at the hotels, meal gratuities, GUIDES and DRIVERS rendering services TOTALING \$120.00 are included.

TAXES: Service charges as imposed by lodging facilities, taxes by local administrations and government authorities on lodging are included on all services rendered to the group. Airport taxes, and fuel surcharge totaling \$730.00 are included in the price of the tour and are subject to change without prior notice. Visa fee \$30.00 is included.
